The owner of 4chan issued a warning over the weekend that the service's anarchic bulletin board is in a financial position. What I wrote on 4chan was true, Hiroyuki Nishimura told the BBC. Advertising revenues are getting worse and costs are getting higher because of more users. While some will not mourn his loss, others will miss his influence and sense of chaos. Perhaps most notably, this is considered the birthplace of the Anonymous movement. Hacktivists are said to have taken the name as a nod to the fact all posts on the site have been marked as being posted on an anonymous rather than another username since 2004.The singer Rick Astley can thank 4chan for helping revive his career, due to a user creating a Rickrolling meme - in which one of his music videos is shared under false pretenses. Launched by Christopher Moot Poole in October 2003, 4chan hosts boards dedicated to a wide range of topics from anime and manga to video games, music, literature, fitness, politics and sports, among others. Registration is not possible and users of the site are usually posted anonymously; threads that receive the last answers are snapped on the top of the board, and old threads are automatically deleted as new ones are created. As of June 2020, 4chan receives more than 22 million unique visitors per month, with about 900,000 messages published daily. The site was created as an analogue of the Japanese image board Futaba Channel, also known as 2chan, and the first boards were created to post images and discussion related to the anime. 4chan has been described as the center of an internet subculture, with the site's community being influential in shaping and distributing prominent internet memes, including lolcats, rickrolling, and furious comics, as well as activists and political movements such as Anonymous and the alt-right. 4chan has often been the subject of media attention as a source of controversy, including the coordination of pranks, harassment, attacks on other websites and Internet users, as well as the posting of illegal content, threats of violence, misogyny and racism. The Guardian once summed up the 4chan community as crazy, underage... brilliant, funny and disturbing. Von Christopher Poole, founder of 4chan, at the XXXO Festival in 2012 Most of the publications on 4chan take place on image boards where users have the opportunity to share images and create threaded discussions. The main page of the site lists 70 image boards and one Flash animation board, divided into seven categories: Japanese culture, video games, interests, creative, others, Misc. (NSFW) and Adult (NSFW). Each board has its own set of rules and is dedicated to a specific theme in different ways including anime and manga, video games, music, literature, fitness, politics and sports, among others. From 2019, the most daily posts are received by boards of directors /pol/ (Politically incorrect), /v/ (Video Games Generals) and /b/ (Random). 4chan is the most common image board on the Internet. Los Angeles Times. Alexa rank 4chan is 1042 by June 2020, although it was as high as 56. It is provided to its users for free and consumes a large amount of bandwidth; as a result, its financing is often problematic. Poole acknowledged that donations alone can't keep the site online, and turned to advertising to help make ends meet. However, the explicit content posted on 4chan has scared away companies that do not want to be associated with the site's content. In January 2009, Poole signed a new contract with an advertising company. In February 2009 it was \$20,000 in debt and the site continues to lose money. 4chan servers were moved from Texas to California in August 2008, which increased the maximum bandwidth of 4chan from 100Mbit/s to 1Gbit/s. At the registration site, 4chan provided trip codes as an additional form of authentication for the poster's authenticity. Because creating a post without filling the Name field results in posts being attributed to Anonymous, the general understanding on 4chan states that Anonymous is not a single person, but a team of users. Moderators usually post without a name, even when performing sysop actions. Capcode can be used to attribute a post to Anonymous Mod, although moderators often post without a capcode. In a 2011 interview with Nico Dauga, Poole explained that about 20 volunteer moderators are active at 4chan. Identifying yourself as a janitor is grounds for immediate dismissal. 4chan was the target of random denial of service attacks. For example, on December 28, 2010, 4chan and other websites went down because of such an attack, after which Poole said in his blog: We now join the ranks of MasterCard, Visa, PayPal and other exclusive club! The Story Site was launched in 4chan.net on October 1, 2003 by Christopher Poole, a 15-year-old student from New York who uses the online handle moot. Poole was a regular contributor to The Anime Death Tentacle Rape, where many users were familiar with the Japanese imageboard format and the Futaba Channel (2chan.net). When 4chan was created, Poole received the futaba Channel's open source code and translated Japanese into English using AltaVista's Babel Fish online translator. (note 1) After the creation of the site, Poole invited users from the ADTRW sub-forum, many of whom were dissatisfied with the site's moderation, to visit 4chan, which he advertised as The English-language analogue of the Futaba channel and a place for Western fans to discuss anime and manga. At the time of its founding, only one board was placed on the site: /b/ (Anime/Random). (Note 1) Several new anime-related boards were added before the end of 2003, including /v/ (Hentai), /c/ (Anime/Cute), /d/ (Hentai/Alternative), /w/ (Wallpapers/Anime), /y/ (Yaoi) and /a/ (Anime). In addition, the lolicon board was set up on /l/ (Lolikon), but was disabled after posting genuine child pornography and was eventually removed in October 2004 4chan.net, following threats of a lawsuit 4chan.org. On March 1, 2004, Poole announced that he lacked the funds to pay his server bill for a month, but was able to continue his activities after receiving a swarm of donations from users. In June 2004, 4chan endured six weeks of downtime after Paypal suspended 4chan's donation service after receiving complaints about the site's content. After the return of 4chan, several non-animate boards were introduced, including /k/ (Weapon), /o/ (Auto) and /v/ (Video Games). In 2008, nine new boards were created, including a sports board on /s/, a fashion board on /f/ and Japan/General (the name was later changed to Otaku Culture) in /jp/. In January 2011, Poole announced the removal of boards: /r/k/ (ROBOT9000) and /new/ (News), stating that /new/ has become a racist discussion, and /r/k/ no longer served its original purpose of being a test implementation of the ROBOT9000 xkcd scenario. In the same year, a board was created to reduce the number of socialization flows by /b/ /r/k/ was reinstated on October 23, 2011, along with /h/ (hardcore, previously removed), /pol/ (rebranded /new/) and a new /diy/ board, in addition to Poole's apology, where he recalls how he criticized the removal of the Encyclopedia Dramatica and realized that he did the same. In 2010, 4chan implemented reCAPTCHA in an attempt to prevent spam related to JavaScript worms. By November 2011, 4chan had switched to Cloudflare after a series of DDoS attacks. 4chan imageboards were rewritten in valid HTML5/CSS3 in May 2012 in an attempt to improve performance on the customer side. On September 28, 2012, 4chan introduced a 4chan pass that, when purchased, allows users to bypass reCAPTCHA verification input when posting and reporting messages on 4chan image boards; money collected from passes will be used to support the site. Hiroyuki Nishimura, owner of 4chan since 2015 on January 21, 2015, Poole quit his job as the site's administrator, citing the stress of disputes such as Gamergate as the reason for his departure. On September 21, 2015, Poole announced that Hiroyuki Nishimura had bought ownership of his property without disclosing the terms of the acquisition. Nishimura was a former administrator of 2channel from 1999 to 2014, a website that formed the basis for an anonymous posting culture that influenced later websites such as the Futaba and 4chan channel; Nishimura lost the 2channel domain after it was seized by its registrar, Jim Watkins, after the latter reported financial difficulties. In October 2016, it was reported that the site faced financial difficulties that could lead to its closure or radical changes. In a post titled Winter Is Coming, Hiroyuki Nishimura said: We tried to keep 4chan as it is. But I failed. I sincerely regret citing server costs, infrastructure costs and network fees. On November 17, 2018, it was announced that the site would be split into two and the work boards would be moved to a new domain, 4channel.org, while NSFW boards would remain on 4chan.org domain. In a series of posts on the subject, Nishimura explained that the split was due to 4chan being blacklisted by most advertising companies, and that the new 4channel domain would allow the site to receive advertising from major ad providers. Christopher Poole hid his identity in real life until it was revealed on July 9, 2008 in The Wall Street Journal. Before that, he used the pseudonym moot. In April 2009, Poole was recognized as the most influential person in the world in 2008 by an open internet survey conducted by Time magazine. The results were questioned even before the poll was completed, as automated voting programs and hand-stuffing for voting were used to influence the vote. 4chan's intervention in the voting seemed increasingly likely when it was revealed that reading the first letter of the first 21 candidates in the poll spelled out a phrase containing two 4chan memes: mARBLECAKE. IT'S ALSO A GAME. On September 12, 2009, Poole raised the question of why 4chan has a reputation as the Meme Factory at the Paraflovs Symposium in Vienna, Austria, which was part of the Paraflovs 09, the theme art of Urban Hacking. In this conversation, Poole mostly attributed this to an anonymous system, as well as the lack of storage on the site (The site has no memory). In April 2010, Poole testified in the United States Court against David Kernell as a government witness. As a witness, he explained to the prosecutor the terminology used on 4chan, ranging from OP and lurker. He also explained to the court the nature of the data handed over to the FBI as part of the search warrant, including how users can be unequivocally identified from the site's audit logs. The sticky thread on the front page states that the purpose of the council is to discuss news, world events, political issues and other related topics. /pol/ was established in October 2011 as a 4chan's 4chan's board, /new/, which was excluded that January for a large volume of racist discussion. Media sources described /pol/ as predominantly racist and sexist, with many of his posts clearly being neo-Nazi. At the center of southern poverty law, the rhetorical style /pol/s is widely emulated by white supremacist websites such as The Daily Stormer; Stormer's editor, Andrew Anglin, agreed. There were published screenshots of the hacked accounts of Trayvon Martin on social networks. The council's users launched anti-feminist, homophobic, transphobic and anti-Arab campaigns on Twitter. Many /pol/ users opted for Donald Trump during his 2016 U.S. presidential campaign. Both Trump and his son, Donald Trump Jr., appear to have acknowledged support by tweeting /pol/associated memes. After his successful election, /pol/ moderator embeddedd pro-Trump videos at the top of all the pages of the board of directors. The main article: /b/ accidental board, /b/, follows the design of the Futaba channel Nijura board. It was the first board set up, and was described in 2009 as 4chan's most popular board, accounting for 30% of site traffic at the time. Nick Douglas of Gawker summed up /b/ as a board where people try to shock, entertain and coax free from each other. /b/ has a no rules policy, except for bans on certain illegal content such as child pornography, intrusions on other websites (the placement of floods of destructive content) and viewing under the age of 18, all of which are inherited from the rules throughout the site. Rule no intrusions was added in late 2006, after /b/ users spent most of this summer invoking the Habbo Hotel. The no rules policy also applies to administrators and moderators, which means that users can be blocked at any time, for any reason, including for no reason. Partly because of its anonymity, the moderation of the board is not always successful, indeed, the rule of the site to combat child pornography is the subject of jokes on /b/. Christopher Poole told The New York Times, in a discussion about moderation/b/ that power lies in the community to dictate its own standards and that the site's employees simply provided a framework. The noise of many users who call themselves /b/tards is often incomprehensible to newcomers and outsiders, and is characterized by intricate inside jokes and dark comedy. Users often call each other and much of the outside world like cigarettes. They are often referred to as trolls who regularly act with the intention of doing it for lulz, the corruption of LOL used to refer to entertainment at the expense of another. The New York Observer described the posters as immature pranksters whose bad behavior is encouraged by the complete anonymity of the site and archives. Douglas said of the board, Reading /b/ will melt your brain, and quoted encyclopedia Encyclopedia definition /b/ as an asshole of the Internet. Matthias Schwartz of The New York Times compared the school bathroom to a shop or obscene phone line, while the Baltimore City Paper wrote that in high school, the Internet is a kid with a collection of butterfly knives and a locker full of. Internet Culture Early Internet Memes Many early memes that originated in 4chan, attracted media attention. This included So I Herd Off, like muidkipz (sic), which included a phrase based on Pokemon and which sparked numerous YouTube tribute videos, and the term Hero (sic) as synonymous with suicide, following a typo in Myspace online memorial to seventh grader Mitchell Henderson. 4chan and other websites, such as the satirical encyclopedia Dramatica, have also contributed to the development of a significant number of leetspeak. Image lolcat with the help of I in your... The lolcat format is an image that combines a photo of a cat with a text designed to promote humor. The text is often peculiar and grammatically incorrect. In 2005, the meme became widely popular with 4chan in the form of Caturday. Every Saturday, users have photos of cats with macro images relevant to the theme of the day. In 2005, a meme known as duck began after Poole used a word filter to change egg to duck after 4chan. Thus, words such as eggroll have been changed to duckroll. This led to a bait and switch in which external references disguised as a relationship to the discussion instead led to a picture of a duck on wheels. An unknown 4chan user applied the concept of ducks to the 2007 post concerning the video game Grand Theft Auto IV. In March of the same year, a trailer for the game was released, and the huge popularity of the game led to the collapse of the site of the publisher Rockstar Games. The user posted a link to YouTube that allegedly led to the trailer, but actually directed users to the music video for Rick Astley's 1987 song Never Goin' to Give You Up. This is how the rickroll was born. In an interview with the Los Angeles Times, Astley said he found the meme weird and funny. A link to a YouTube video of Tay Sondei's song Chocolate Rain was posted on July 11, 2007. The Age reported that 4chan's posters encouraged each other to break up videos on YouTube and thereby increase their rating. The video has become an extremely popular internet meme, in cover versions of John Mayer and Green Day drummer Tre Cool. Part of the song, in which Sundal turns away from the microphone with the caption I'll move away from the microphone to inhale, became an off-repeated 4chan meme and inspired remixes. Boxxy's character is portrayed by Katherine Catie Wayne, an American internet celebrity known for his energetic vlogs. Her growth in exposure began in late 2008 and early 2009, surrounding homemade videos that were originally posted on her Gaia Online profile. They then spread to 4chan and other sites, leading to a large online following. In its American incarnation, Pedonos is an anthropomorphic bearish child predator that is often used in the community for mocking contributors, showing a sexual interest in children. Pedobear is one of the most popular memes on non-English image boards, and has gained acclaim across Europe. In February 2010, the photoshop version of Pedobear appeared with the mascots of the 2010 Winter Olympics in an article about the Games in the Polish newspaper Gazeta Olsztyńska. This was done by accident; Because of the image used by Google Images, the authors were unaware of the joke. Similarly, Dutch television guide Avrotoede used one of the images. It was used as a symbol of paedophilia by Maltese graffiti vandals prior to the papal visit. Anonymous and Anti-Amenological Activism Protests Against Scientology See also: Anonymous (group) and Project Chanology 4chan was tagged as the starting point of an anonymous meme Baltimore City Paper, due to the norm of messages signed with Anonymous nicknames. The National Post's David George-Kosh said it was widely reported that Anonymous is associated with 4chan and 711chan, as well as numerous Internet Relay Chat (IRC) channels. Through its association with Anonymous, 4chan has become associated with Project Chanology, a worldwide outcry against the Church of Scientology conducted by members of Anonymous. On January 15, 2008, a 4chan user posted on /b/, inviting participants to do something big against the Church of Scientology website. This message led to the Church receiving threatening phone calls. It quickly escalated into a big real protest. Unlike previous Anonymous attacks, the action featured 4chan memes including Rickrolls and Guy Fawkes masks. The raid drew criticism from some 4chan users who believed it would bring the site unwanted attention. My Little Pony: Friendship Is Magic Forum The adult fandom and subculture, dedicated to the children's animated series My Little Pony: Friendship Is Magic, began on the 4chan board Comics and Cartoons. The show was first discussed with some interest around its debut in October 2010. In an article published on the cartoon site Cartoon Brew, titled The End of the Era in TV Animation, writer Amid Amidli referred to the then-recent debut of the show as an example of how the talent of creators such as Lauren Faust was used for work on behalf of established toy-centric properties rather than original ideas developed by the creators themselves. The article was extended to /c/, where the alarmist tone of the essay sparked increased interest in the show, resulting in praise for its plot, characters and animation style. The moderation of topics related to My Little Pony on 4chan has become controversial; The discussion of the show spread to the board /b/, reaching volume and intrusiveness, which was eventually met with a hostile reaction from other 4chan users. This led to intervention by the moderator, with the introduction of an automatic one-day ban on the use of the word pony to prevent discussion of the show. Discussion of the show began to spread to the community outside 4chan's response, including the creation of fan news site Equestria Daily, bringing the show to reach a wider audience over the internet. These events were described as a civil war internally to 4chan. 104 Site administrator's dispute eventually settled the matter by creating a panel dedicated to the show's discussion, Pony (/mlp/), and apologized on behalf of the moderation team for neglecting one of the largest subcultures in 4chan history. There is a ban on discussing shows around the world on a site outside of this board. Other media arrests for animal cruelty on February 15, 2009, a user uploaded two YouTube videos that showed the physical abuse of a domestic cat named Dusty The Man calling himself Timmy. The 4chan community managed to track down the video's creator, a fourteen-year-old from Lawton, Oklahoma, and passed his details to the local police department. As a result, the suspect was arrested, and the cat was treated by a veterinarian and taken to a safe place. Later, the user, after the approval of other anonymous users in the stream, set up an auction on eBay for a framed photo that quickly rose to high prices, culminating in a price of \$90,900.00. The unidentified person who made the reports may have been the first defendant in violation of the Privacy Act, prompting a review of the New York fire Controversial Internet attacks See also: Anonymous (group) 4chan raids (2003-2007), and Sarah Palin's email hack According to The Washington Post, users of the site managed to pull off some of the most high-profile collective action in internet history. Users of 4chan and other websites attacked Hal Turner by launching DDoS attacks and pranks, calling his phone radio show in December 2006 and January 2007. The attacks have left Turner's site offline. It cost thousands of dollars of bandwidth bills according to Turner. In response, Turner sued 4chan, 7chan and other websites; however, he had lost his request for an injunction and had not received letters from the court. On July 26, 2007, KTTV Fox 11 aired a report on Anonymous, calling them a group of steroid hackers, internal terrorists and collectively the internet hate machine. Slashdot founder Rob Malda posted a comment from another Slashdot user, Miang, saying the story focused mainly on 4chan, 7chan and 420chan users. Miang argued that the report seems confused by the raids and motivational poster templates with a genuine threat to the American public, claiming that the unrelated footage of the van explosion shown in the report was equating anonymous messages with domestic terrorism. On July 10, 2008, a character with a CJK unicode swastika (卐) appeared at the top of Google's hot trend list for several hours, counting the most commonly used search terms in the United States. It was later reported that a html numerical link to the symbol was posted on /b/ asking you to perform a Google search for the line. Many visitors followed the order and pushed the symbol to the top of the chart, although Google later deleted the letter. Later that year, the private account of Yahoo! Mail of Sarah Palin, the Republican vice presidential candidate in the 2008 presidential election, was hacked by a 4chan user. The hacker posted the account password on /b/ and screenshots from the WikiLeaks account. The user then logged in and changed the password by posting a screenshot in which he sent a letter to a friend of Palin's, informing her of a new password on the stream /b/ However, he forgot to clear the password on the screenshot. Many users tried to log in with a new password, and the account was automatically blocked by Yahoo!. The incident has been criticized by some /b/ users, in that most of the hacking reports focus on 4chan rather than violating Palin's campaign law. One user commented: Seriously, /b/. We could have changed history and failed, epically. The FBI and Secret Service began investigating the incident shortly after it appeared. On September 20, it was reported that they were questioning David Kernell, the son of Tennessee Democratic Representative Mike Kernell. Apple Inc.'s share price has fallen significantly The hoax story was reported by cnn's custom news site iReport.com claiming that the company's CEO Steve Jobs suffered a serious heart attack. The source of the story was traced to 4chan. A member of 4chan admitted his role in the attack, telling BBC News it was in response to YouTube 'removing music'. In January 2010, users of the site again attacked YouTube in response to the blocking of YouTube user lukeywes1234 for non-compliance with the minimum age requirement of thirteen years. Videos uploaded by the user appear to have become popular with 4chan members, who subsequently became angry after the account was suspended and called for a new wave of pornographic videos to be uploaded to YouTube on January 6, 2010. Later that year, 4chan made numerous devastating pranks aimed at singer Justin Bieber. In September 2010, in retaliation against the hiring of Bollywood film industry Aiplex Software to launch cyberattacks against The Pirate Bay, anonymous members recruited through posts on 4chan boards subsequently launched their own attacks, dubbed Operation Payback, targeting the website of the American FilmMen's Association and the Recording Industry Association of America.
